Introduction:

- 1. Begin with a prayer, inviting God's presence into your small group discussion.

Discussion Questions:

4. The Risk of Favor

- Discuss the potential risks associated with divine favor mentioned in the article, such as pride and fear. How can we guard against these pitfalls?
- Share personal stories or insights on how navigating the risks of favor has shaped your spiritual journey.

5. The Outcome of Favor

- Explore Isaiah 61:3-4, 7. How do these verses illustrate the transformative outcomes of God's favor?
- In what ways have you seen or experienced the restoration and joy described in these verses through divine favor?

Application and Prayer:

- 1. Encourage each group member to identify an area in their life where they desire God's favor and commit to responding in humility and surrender.
- 2. Spend time in prayer, asking God for His favor on each member of the group and for the wisdom to navigate the challenges and risks associated with it.
