8. Reflect on the concept of self-imposed requirements and how they may distract you from focusing on what truly matters. What self-imposed requirements do you struggle with, and how do they affect your willingness to serve?

9. Consider the implications of Jesus' words to Martha: "one thing is necessary." What does it mean for you to prioritize sitting at the feet of Jesus in the midst of your serving commitments? 10. As you think about freeing up emotional bandwidth, what practical steps can you take to cultivate a deeper connection with God and others while serving?
