

Sermon Reflection Guide: "The Heart of Serving"

- Reflect on your personal journey of serving in the church. Have you ever found yourself serving out of necessity rather than a specific calling? What motivated your initial involvement in serving?

Understanding the Heart of Serving:

1. Scripture Reflection:

- Read and meditate on **Matthew 6:9-10** (The Lord's Prayer). What insights do you gain about the heart of serving from this passage?

2. Key Points:

- What are key elements of the heart of serving? (Relationship with the Father, Bringing glory to Jesus, Focusing on God's Kingdom, Following God's will, Accomplished in and through me)
- How do these elements resonate with your understanding of serving in God's Kingdom?

3. Spiritual Growth Through Serving:

- Consider the statement, "The best way to grow spiritually is to serve." How does serving cultivate spiritual growth?

4. Impact on the Body of Christ:

- Reflect on the idea that when someone is not serving, the Body of Christ suffers. How does this concept align with the biblical metaphor of the Body of Christ in 1 Corinthians 12? How have you seen this principle in action?

5. Experiencing the Fullness of Life:

- Discuss the statement, "We will never experience the fullness of life Jesus promised apart from serving in His Kingdom." How does serving connect with discovering God's purpose for your life?

1 Peter 4:10 - Our Theme Verse:

6. Context of Urgency:

- Explore the context of 1 Peter 4:10 in verse 7 ("The end of all things is at hand"). How does the urgency mentioned in the scripture impact your understanding of serving in today's world?

7. Self-Control in Serving:

- Reflect on the two forms of self-control mentioned in serving: becoming involved and avoiding over-involvement. How can self-control enhance the quality of service in the church?

8. Love Covering a Multitude of Sins:

- Consider the role of love in serving, as mentioned by Peter. How does love contribute to the effectiveness and unity of God's Kingdom?

Discovering Your Call to Serve:

9. Reflecting on Past Experiences:

- Take time to reflect on your past experiences, jobs, and skills. How can these experiences contribute to your role in serving God's Kingdom?

10. Compliments and Confirmations:

- Reflect on the compliments and remarks you've received in your life. How can these affirmations guide you in discovering your unique gifts and calling?

11. Understanding Limitations:

- Acknowledge areas where you may have attempted to serve but were unsuccessful. How can recognizing your limitations be a valuable part of discovering your true calling?

12. Trusting God's Guidance:

- Discuss the speaker's perspective on God's ability to call us to areas where we have no experience. How can you trust God's guidance in areas that may be outside your comfort zone?

13. Practical Steps:

- Evaluate the practical steps suggested for finding your place of serving. Have you ever tried talking with a pastor or exploring ministries for a limited time?
